

Message from the Superintendent

Dear La Center Families,

The 2019-2020 school year certainly didn't lack surprises. When the Governor closed schools in the beginning of March due to the COVID-19 pandemic, our entire district found itself in a challenging and unprecedented situation. The district needed to pivot drastically to provide online learning via a subpar community transmission grid with little notice to staff who were willing to learn, but unfamiliar with how to teach on this new platform. Additionally, and probably most importantly, our students were as unprepared and unfamiliar as our staff.

But we didn't let these hardships stop us! Over the end of the last school year and the first half of the next, I couldn't be more impressed and proud of the dedication of our staff, the hard work of our students and the understanding of our families as we made the shift to full online We distributed learning. over 1000 chromebooks to our students across the district. Our staff has attended thousands of hours of training and our families have undergone scheduling changes to make online learning the best it can be under the circumstances.

Our seniors waited until August in the hopes of being able to have a traditional graduation, but alas, the COVID-19 virus permanently nixed those wishes and we were left with a drivethrough ceremony that was well-attended but left everyone nostalgic for the return of our traditions.

In closing, I want you to know that the entire district looks forward to the day the health department decides we can safely return every student to the classroom. Don't lose hope, that time will come. By continuing to work together, sooner rather than later, our lives and educational routines will return to normal.








OSPI Report Card Statistics


Due to the COVID-19 outbreak closures, most standardized assessments were not offered during the 2019-2020 school year.

A Smattering of Great Stuff!!



Our students worked hard on student led club opportunities throughout the year. Some of these opportunities included:

Bobcat Ambassadors: grades 4/5 leading many events and efforts throughout the school year

Bobcat Bike Club: grades 4/5, setting up and riding bikes weekly

Historians: grades 3-5, video/photo responsibilities, learning videos, photos for slideshow, newsletters and more

Landscape Leadership Team: grades 3-5, designing and leading landscaping projects, building wood structures, and more


Paw Print Team: grades 3-5, painting and repainting paw prints to designate mindful zones on campus

Recess Medics: grades 4/5, supporting students at designated recess with bandages, injury support, and escorting injured or ill to office/nurse

Recycling Team: grades 3-5, recycling weekly to take school recyclables to recycling container

Crossing Guard: grades 4-5, support safe crossing before and after school

MIDDLE SCHOOL



Honor Roll/Academic Improvements: 30 students improved their overall GPA by 0.5 points or more between last year's second semester and this year's first semester. A total of 145 students made honor roll.

Classroom Removal Improvements: The MS implemented "restorative practices" in an attempt to keep students in class. Instead of sending a student directly out of class, a series of steps were implemented leading to a 92% reduction in red slips/referrals during the first semester (from 123 trips for 28 students down to 10 trips for 7 students).

Math Is Cool: 11 students participated in the Regional Championship 'Math is Cool' competition at Skyview High School in February. An 8th grade team and two 6th grade teams attended the competition. One 6th grade team and the 8th grade team qualified for the masters level state competition.

HIGH SCHOOL



Vocational Programs La Center High School currently provides programs in: business, keyboarding and computer applications and industrial arts (which includes small engine repair, woods 1 and woods 2 and metals 1 and metals 2). In 2019-2020 we added Google Suites, accounting, Microsoft Office, personal finance, residential construction/onsite learning and CTE/environmental studies. ASB club activities such as FBLA and Leo's Club support the curriculum in these vocational programs.



LCHS CLASS OF 2020 Challenge Accepted!


