

La Center School District Library Annual Report 2021-2022

Elementary Library:

The total number of classes using the library was 33 classes in grades K-5. Each grade receives a 30-minute time of library instruction and checkout each week. During the 2021-2022 school year, 725+ patrons checked out 34,591 titles.

Collection Size: 14,800 titles
Collection Value: \$289,755.66

The elementary library transitioned from a K-8 library to a K-5 library. Books were reorganized to create age-related areas for K-2 (primary) and 3-5 (intermediate) reading areas.

Middle School Library:

Middle school students receive individualized instruction based on needs. During the 2021-2022 school year, 418+ patrons checked out 2,831 titles.

High School Library:

High school students receive individualized instruction based on needs. During the 2020-2021 school year, 536+ patrons checked out 4,665 titles.

Collection Size: 9888 titles
Collection Value: \$187,036.16

The high school library is now where students receive Chromebooks. The library checks out Chromebooks to students, sends Chromebooks to the Technology Department for repairs and can assist students and staff with Chromebook concerns.

Sept. 26-Oct. 2 - The high school library participated in the ALA (American Library Association) banned book week by displaying books and providing relevant information about the history of "Challenged Books" across the United States.

At the end of the school year, the library collected over 500 Chromebooks from students to inventory, repair, barcode and store for checkout the next school year.
