



Total Enrollment 2023-2024 1831


Attendance by Grade Band *22-23 most recent data available Students attending 90% or more school days















For school year 2023-2024, La Center School District had 108 classroom teachers with an average 14.23 years of teaching experience.



SCHOOL LEADER PARADIGM Becoming While Doing



In working towards the goal, the district used the School Leader Paradigm and Framework that was developed through the Washington State MTSS (Multi-Tiered Systems of Support). This is work that LCSD started in 2021.

The Framework's focus: 1. Team-driven shared leadership. Leadership teams share the responsibility to support all adults in the school building by planning, coordinating, monitoring and adjusting in service of student learning and social-emotional growth. 2. Data-based decision making. School teams use an agreed-upon process to guide instructional next steps, determine the root

causes of problems and successes, then coordinate supports more effectively when they review academic, social, emotional and behavioral data together. **3. Family, student and community engagement.** Work to build systems that create supportive learning environments by building partnerships with families, the community, staff, and students. **4. Continuum of support.** Instruction, enrichment, and interventions are delivered along a continuum to meet the full spectrum of academic needs of students. Tier 1, the foundation and focus for core instruction that is research-based, accessible, and aligned to grade-level standards. Tier 2, supports are an additional layer of targeted, evidence-based interventions. Tier 3, supports are an additional layer of intensive, evidence-based interventions that have been individualized to meet the needs of students who demonstrate significant risk and do not respond to tier 2 interventions. **5. Evidence-based practices.** Implementation of activities, strategies or interventions that have been proven to improve student outcomes.


