Message from the Superintendent

Dear La Center Families.

The 2022-2023 school year was an amazing year focused on academics and families. Passing our levy in August of 2022 allowed our team to quickly hire and restore budget cuts from the prior school year. We were methodical in our approach to the year as we focused on reading, writing, mathematics, and science. Of course, we teach social studies, physical education, the arts, and more, however, the focus is on removing the distractions from our students and making progress toward achieving academic success.

On the surface, it may have appeared that we were distracted with significant work on policy to reinforce that the parent is the first teacher and that we collaborate with parents. We were able to maintain a significant focus on academics in what I call an advance to basics. The school shutdowns that impacted the prior years are still affecting our students and we are working feverishly to make up for lost learning ground.

We developed significant industry partnerships with local companies such as Quail Homes, Tapani Plumbing Inc., Rotschy, Inc., Wolf Industries, Builders First Source, and River City Enterprises. We will be starting construction coursework in the fall of 2023 with the plan to have over eighty students enrolled learning the construction trade. We are working to ensure students are ready for the year after graduation, or what I call grade 13.

We made significant gains in reading and mathematics instruction and provided a high level of professional development for our teachers to improve how we work with every student. We maintain our commitment to the district mission as it serves students and families:




We have an amazing community and we continue to serve the children and families. The learning and student growth we will see in the coming years will be amazing. Thank you for allowing our teams to serve your families!






Total Enrollment 2022-2023 1747









As listed in the 2022-23 District Strategic Improvement Plan, the District's goals to achieve the mission are:

Goal 1: All students, regardless of circumstance or ability, will have access to instruction in order to grow and achieve academically and socially.

This is accomplished through the following strategies: Professional learning activities; strong core instruction and measuring of success; academic tiered interventions, using targeted small group support and individual intensive support; and Professional development opportunities for staff.

Goal 2: All students in the La Center School District will have opportunities to develop the social skills to be confident and self-reliant learners (not only social skills, but handling emotions as well).

This is accomplished by using the following strategies: SEL Standards, SEL Tiered Interventions, and Relationship Building. Understanding mental health and teaching children how to recognize, cope, or get help with mental health or social anxieties leads to students being more confident and self-reliant.


