SUPERINTENDENT'S INTERPRETATION OF POLICY

The Board expects the La Center School District to stay connected with stakeholders and ensure that students, parents, and staff have ample opportunities to provide feedback and promote discourse. This has been the primary focus of my work in working to fulfill my obligation within the district mission; "... in partnership with families, the community, staff, and students..."

REPORT

There are three specific areas described in this policy. The following will address all 3 areas of EL-9 as best as possible. At the time of this report, I believe that the LCSD complies with the Board's expectations.

1-3 The superintendent shall not fail to regularly survey <u>listen to</u> students, parents, staff, and community perspectives about the quality of their learning experiences. <u>IN COMPLIANCE</u>

Our primary approach to understanding the experiences of individuals within our community relies on the use of linkages. These serve as invaluable platforms for engaging with various stakeholders, including students, parents, staff, and community members. Through student and staff linkages, we employ powerful methods such as small group discussions to gain insights into the dynamics within our district. Moreover, we've adapted community linkages to offer informative presentations on forthcoming events and essential district updates, fostering

In addition to formal linkages, I actively seek feedback from stakeholders through more informal channels. Engaging with organizations like the Lions Club, connecting with patrons at local establishments, and contributing to community initiatives like Our Days further strengthens our connections. Regular attendance at city council meetings provides another avenue to engage with community leaders, offering monthly updates on our school's achievements and addressing any concerns or misconceptions.
