Safety Drill Update for LCES

Did you know that we practice a school wide safety drill at least once a month? This month (October) we are practicing an earthquake drill scenario. We had our first fire drill scheduled at the end of September and review our drills for a few details. This is in the event of a fire on our campus that requires a school wide evacuation. At that time we have all students and staff relocate to a designated location away from the building, then have a system to account for every student. A common scenario for this event could be a fire in the kitchen for example. Things we look for as a team when doing the fire drill:

- 1. Did classes get out quickly and orderly?
- 2. Did everyone know where to go?
- 3. Did the mechanics of the alarm work effectively?
- 4. Was everyone accounted for?
- 5. Was communication from the incident command center and staff clear and effective?
- 6. Staff feedback for any areas of improvement?

Playground Under Construction

Our west playground near the round building and cafeteria was in need of an additional covered play area so students had a place to play when it rains. This summer, construction began and is well under way. We anticipate the structure will be up and ready for students by the end of September. Just in time for the rainy season (fingers crossed). In the meantime, our students have been playing on the football field over by the bus zone on the opposite side of our campus.

Stay tuned for updates. We are all anxiously looking forward to the improved playground area.



Bullying Prevention Lessons

At La Center Elementary, we are teaching all students to use the stoplight approach of Stop (red light), Support (yellow light), and Report (green light). Bullying is hurtful, repeated behavior that involves an imbalance of power as opposed to rough-and-tumble play or conflict that happens between peers of equal status.
